# Give and Go

- One of the most fundamental two-man game plays
- Basic Execution:
  1. Player 1 with ball will make a pass to Player 2 without ball
  2. Player 1 will make a cut towards the basket
  3. Player 2 will try to find Player 1 with a pass for a shot/layup



# Pick and Roll

- A **pick/screen** is whereby a teammate without the ball comes over to act as a “**wall**” for his teammate with the ball to **get by the defence** easily
- A roll is when the **screener** goes towards the **RIM** after setting the screen for a layup opportunity
- This creates **opportunities** for both the screener and ball handler
- For ball handlers, remember to **not move** until the screen is **set firmly**. Otherwise the screener could be called for an “illegal screen” while trying to help you execute the screen.

# Pick and Pop

- Similar to pick and roll
- Key difference lies in the screener going away from the basket for a shooting opportunity instead of layup.
- Opens up the floor by having the screener go away from the basket
- Can be used when you have a strong dribbler who can penetrate the defence easily and a screen setter who can shoot the ball well



# 3 Man/Woman Game

- Making use of 3 man to execute an offence gameplay
- Usually a combination of:
  1. Backdoor Cuts
  2. Front Cuts
  3. Give and Go
  4. Pick and Roll
  5. Pick and Pop





# Conclusion

- All types of **set plays** and **game play tactics** are to guide **you** and give you a rough idea. You don't have to follow it exactly like a robot
- At the B Division level, you **must get moving** to get easy baskets. No standing around waiting for the ball
- Watching more **game film** together as team will improve your understanding at the same time so you all will be on the same page and can **work together BETTER**
